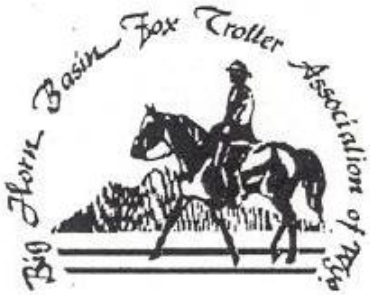

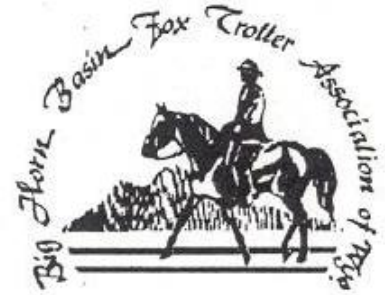
Montana Fall Gather

GENERAL INFORMATION

We are proud to have Mr. Elmer Scott as our judge this year. He is well versed in all areas of the Missouri Fox Trotter Breed from breeding, showing, training, and judging. He has a solid background in Versatility as well as Performance.

Entry Deadline is June 7, 2012. Entries and fees must be postmarked by June 7, 2012. Registration before June 7 is \$10.00 per class for members, \$12.00 for non-members. After June 7, class fees will be \$15.00 per class. Cancellations before June 7 will be given a refund less a \$15.00 handling fee. There will be no refund for cancellations after June 7, 2012. Registration and/or class changes on June 14-15-16 can be done between the hours of 7:00 and 9:00 AM.

Wednesday – June 13 – Show Registration will be inside the Arena and open from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. Show Registration will be open Thu, Fri and Sat starting at 7:30 AM. The main arena will be open for riding Wednesday, June 13, 2012.

All Amateur Exhibitors must provide an Amateur Card at the time of registration. If you do not have an Amateur card you may compete in Open classes. Professional Status Cards for Open Exhibitors are not required for this show.

An Entry Form must be completed for each Exhibitor/horse team combination. A copy of your MFTHBA registration papers must be included with your entry form.

If you are arriving before Wednesday, June 13, 2012 you must make prior arrangements with Robynn Gabel, 307-349-2049 for stalls and/or campsites. Do not check in at the Hot Springs County Fairgrounds office. All stalls and campsites are being handled through BHBFTA. All stalls and campsites are on a first come – first serve basis and will be assigned in the order of entry receipt. Please note there are limited (5) campsites with electricity, close to the barn. There are (3) other campsites with electricity located throughout the compound. The camping lot to the east and the parking lot on the west side is open for dry camping and is free.

The State of Wyoming requires a negative Coggins test on all horses coming into Wyoming from out of state or horses crossing county lines. Please have health certificates available when checking in. There may be a vet to do a health check when you arrive at no cost to you.

GAITED CLINIC

Ever wondered if your horse was in the right gait, and if not, how to get them there? Having issues with keeping gait? We are happy to provide a Gaited Clinic, Thursday, June 13, at 9:00 AM for our members. This clinic will be hosted by Jane Zubia of Satin Gaits and Craig Dansie of Dansie Fox Trotters. A Roping Clinic will run concurrently hosted by Mark Goss. This clinic is free to BHBFTA members and registered participants of the BHBFTA Show. If you would like to audit or participate and you are not a member or show participant there will be a charge of \$30.00.

STALLS

Stall fees are \$20.00 a day. Stall fees must accompany your entry fees. If you plan to arrive before Wednesday you must make prior arrangements with the Show Chairman, Robynn Gabel, 307-349-

2049, to have stalls opened. One horse per stall and we ask that you do not use straw, only shavings. If you need shavings you can purchase them from BHBFTA at the show for \$8.00 a bag. You can also pick up shavings from White Horse Feed in Thermopolis. If you need an extra stall for tack purposes only, the fee will be \$15.00 per day. There is a manure collection bin between barns. Please pick up after your horse around the barn area. Any horse kept at the fairgrounds overnight must be stalled and cannot be tied to a trailer. If you are attending just for the day you do not need to rent a stall. If you are camping please do not bring your horse to the campsite. Please do not dump or clean out horse trailers in the parking lot. Pick up and clean up after your horses and deposit manure in collection bins.

CAMPING & RV HOOKUPS

Though we will have a beautiful covered arena for this show, we will be lacking in RV hookups. There are only 5 - 110 hook ups around the barn areas and these will be on a first come, first serve basis on registrations. There will be a \$15.00 per night fee for these hook ups. There are no other electrical, water or sewage hook ups but there is a parking lot for dry camping east of the barns or in the west parking lot. Usage for the dry camping is free. There are no shower facilities on grounds but located in the Thermopolis State Park is the Wyoming Bath House. Open from 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM daily. You can rent towels or suits for \$1.00 or bring your own. Shower facilities and mineral spring soaking are free. Ask Show Chairman for directions.

DIRECTIONS

Whether you are coming from North or South you will be on Hwy 20. From the North as you drop down around the curve into Thermopolis you will look for Hot Springs County Fairgrounds sign on your right and turn right onto Spring View St. Entrance is to your right. Coming in from the South (Wind River Canyon) on Hwy 20 you will go through town through the first big curve to your left then after downtown and several lights road curves to your right. Start looking to your left for the Hot Spring County Fairgrounds sign and turn onto Spring View St. to your left before sign. Entrance is to your right.

THE GOLDEN RULE

Treat the facility as you would treat your own. Please pick up after your horse and yourself in all areas of the Fairgrounds. There will be wheel barrows available in all areas. Please pick up your trash, there will be trash barrels available. Treat everyone as you want to be treated.



SHOW RULES

This Show will be run in accordance with the latest edition of the 2010 MFTHBA Versatility Circuit Championship rules. All rules can be found on the MFTHBA website at <http://www.MFTHBA.com>. It is the responsibility of the participants to know these rules and to be in compliance with the rules for the classes in which they are competing.

Show management has the right to dismiss any exhibitor from the show grounds or any class for non-compliance or violations of rules. Protests will be administered in accordance with Article 700, Section 4 J – Show Protests of the Rulebook. The required documentation and \$300.00 deposit for contesting is to be submitted to the BHBFTA Show Chairman.

Show management has the right to refuse the presence of any horse deemed unhealthy or unfit. Any person not having their horse under sufficient control shall be dismissed from the show ring and disqualified from that class. Show management will not be held responsible for accidents involving contestants, horses, equipment or for the theft of equipment, horse or personal belongings. In order to compete you must have signed and turned in a Waiver of Liability. Once entry form is turned in it is an automatic acceptance of this rule.

All exhibitors are expected to be in the staging area one class prior to their class entry. Gate calls for upcoming classes will be announced but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to be ready. Gate holds may be requested one class prior of the Gate Handler for tack changes. Class entry order will be rotated at the discretion of the Gate Handler.

No tacking up of horses in camping area due to safety reasons. All dogs are to be on a leash and are not allowed in the riding arenas.

All classes, except Championship Classes will place 1st through 5th. Classes with fewer than three entrants maybe cancelled or combined. Trail, Reining, and Horsemanship patterns will be posted at least one hour prior to class.

A rider may exhibit in a class multiple times, with different horses, but each team (rider and horse) compiles points. Rider and horse cannot be mixed for high point accumulation. In classes where all of the exhibitors enter the ring at the same time or fall into place on the rail after performing, a rider will only be able to exhibit one horse in that class.

Two year old fox trotters are not allowed to be shown under saddle.



INTERMOUNTAIN VERSATILITY CIRCUIT RULES

Competitors must be entered in the circuit before the start of the first class of circuit competition at the first circuit show they attend. Competitors may compete in only one division. All Intermountain Versatility Circuit competition will be in accordance with the MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards & Policies in effect at the time of the show. Circuit participation and points awards and accumulation is in accordance with the rules for the 2010 MFTHBA Versatility Circuit Championship in effect at the time of the show. These and all other rules can be found on the MFTHBA website - <http://www.MFTHBA.com>

This is the first leg of the Intermountain Versatility Circuit. The Big Sky Fox Trotter Show will be the next circuit show, at the Sapphire Arena, Corvallis, Mt, July 12-14, 2012. The third and final show is the Great Western Celebration in Farmington, UT, July 25-28, 2012. There are three divisions; Open, Amateur and Youth. A High Point Championship will be awarded to each of these divisions based on the combined point total from all three shows in Versatility. To be eligible for the Versatility Circuit High Point you must compete in a minimum of five Versatility classes with one of those five classes being Barrels. The Intermountain Versatility Circuit classes that will be counted for points in determining the Circuit winners are as follows:

Western Pleasure, Reining, Trail, English Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Barrels, and Showmanship

Points for 1st through 10th in the Division will be reported to MFTHBA. Please note that Western Riding and Hunter Hack classes will not be at all Intermountain Circuit shows. But if you enter these classes in the Circuit shows that have them, those points will be sent on to the MFTHBA office to be counted in the MFTHBA National Versatility Circuit Championship. They will not be counted towards determining the Intermountain Versatility Circuit High Point winners. You carry all points gained in local shows in the classes listed in the National Versatility Championship to the Celebration in the fall, to be added to your total score in the final National Championships. Any questions can be explained by your Show Chairman.

If you qualify as an Amateur and do not have an Amateur Card you can apply for this through the MFTHBA. You must submit a copy of your Amateur Card with your show registration papers if you are going to compete as an Amateur.

Only horse and rider teams will accrue points, not individual horses or riders. Competitors who must change horses may not transfer accrued points to the new horse. A new application must be made for the new horse/rider team.

YOUTH RIDERS - Youth is defined as age 17 or under as of January 1, 2012.

Pleasure Versatility - A High Point Circuit Championship will be awarded in our new division this year, Pleasure Versatility. Only one horse and rider team can accrue points, not individual horses or riders. The qualifying classes for this championship are: **English Pleasure 2 Gait, Country Pleasure 2 Gait, Western Pleasure 2 Gait, and Trail Pleasure 2 Gait..**

Each Competitor may only compete for one Circuit Championship, either Pleasure Versatility or Versatility. Competitors need to declare which they will be competing in at the beginning of the circuit. Due to new changes in the rules your Intermountain Circuit points will also be carried over into the 2012 MFTHBA National Versatility Circuit Championship classes at the Fall Celebration. Classes that will be counted to determine the National winner are as follows:

Western Pleasure - English Pleasure - Showmanship - Western Horsemanship - Trail Reining - Western Riding - Hunter Hack - Barrel Race

MFTHBA APPROVED POINT SHOW PLEASURE GUIDLE LINES

There are no official MFTHBA rules for the Approved Point classes in the Pleasure Category; however the following guidelines are generally accepted.

Country Pleasure: Type of tack and attire is optional, English or Western, but tack/attire should NOT be mixed, (English saddle/Western bridle for example). Horses should have smooth and comfortable gaits and should be judged ore on the pleasure quality of the gaits than correctness of the gaits. The horse should display exceptional manners, be alert and have a willing attitude. The horse should have a quiet nature and be responsive to the rider's commands. The horse should be ridden on a light rein and should not be held in frame. The gaits to be call for are Flat Foot Walk, Favorite Gait/Intermediate Gait (this must not be a canter, lope or hand gallop). Excessively tight reins should be severely penalized and any sign of resistance or ill temper should be penalized. Lack of free forward movement should be penalized.

Western Pleasure: The rules and judging considerations in the Versatility section of the MFTHBA rulebook may be observed, the only difference is that there will be no lope gait. The gaits should be Flat Foot Walk, Fox Trot and if desired the Trial Walk. Correctness of the gaits SHOULD be a consideration. Horses may be asked to back if desired.

Trail Pleasure: The rules are the same as in Country Pleasure except if desired the class may have up to three obstacles to be executed along with the rail work. Obstacles should be kept simple such as a serpentine through cones (walk or favorite gait), walk over logs, walk-in, back out of straight poles, pick up object from one barrel and carry it to another, etc. (See Trail Obstacles in Versatility Section)

English Pleasure: The rules and judging considerations in the Versatility section of the MFTHBA rulebook may be observed, the only difference is that there will be no counter gait. The gaits should be Flat Foot Walk and Fox Trot. Correctness of gaits SHOULD be a consideration.

NATURAL TRAIL COURSE

All tack must be in clean working order. You may dress as you would on the trail. Jeans are acceptable as well as helmets. The cleaner and neater the attire, the better the impression. The horse must be a Missouri Fox Trotter but not necessarily registered. When it is noted "preferred gait" you may do the gait of choice, but more points will be gained by

doing a foxtrot. There are no points accrued for finishing faster than others. The point system for obstacles will be fashioned after the point system used in the MFTHBA rule book. The rules governing bits and excessive or harsh tack will be from the MFTHBA rule book. You may use two hands on the reins no matter the age of the horse. The horse must be 3 years of age and up. There will be no canter; this is a two gait course. You and your horse will be judged on how well you work together and the calmness and responsiveness of the horse in negotiating obstacles. All obstacles will be fashioned after what you would actually encounter on the trail including brush, logs, bridges, animals, bikes, rain slicker, motorized vehicles, tents and water. If you have entered the Trail Course in the Show in either Amateur, Open, Novice or Youth you may only enter this class in Section B of the class number.

BHBFTA ALL AROUND HIGH POINT PERFORMANCE

The High Point Performance Award is open to all 3 year and older horses. The same exhibitor must ride or show the horse in the following Performance Classes. This award will be determined by the highest points accrued by rider and horse in Performance in either Amateur or Open in the following classes: Class # 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 18, 19, 21, 22, 23, and 25.

BHBFTA Versatility High Point – Open – Amateur – Youth

The Versatility High Point is open to all 3 year and older horse and rider teams. Placing will be Champion and Reserve Champion. Exhibitor can only accrue points in their declared status, Open, Amateur and Youth. In order to be eligible for consideration the horse/exhibitor must compete in at least five of the following classes:

Western Pleasure - English Pleasure - Showmanship - Western Horsemanship - Trail - Reining - Barrel Race

BHBFTA All Around High Point

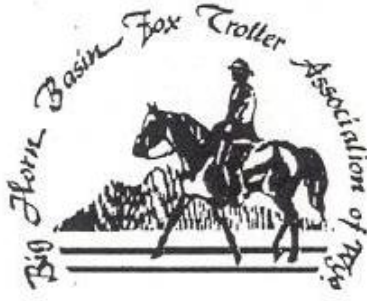
The BHBFTA All Around High Point will be awarded to the horse/rider team with the over-all highest points accrued in the show in the following classes: Model 1 or 2, Showmanship 5 or 6, 2 Gait 13, 14, 15, 16, 3 Gait 18, 19, Western Horsemanship 55, 56, Trail 42, 43, Western Pleasure 48, 49, Reining 52, 53, Barrels, 58, 59.
