GENERAL INFORMATION

Our Show Judge will be Mr. Gary Hays from Frankford, Missouri. Mr. Hays has judged several shows in the West and comes highly recommended for both Versatility and Performance.

Entry Deadline is July 31, 2009. Entries and fees must be postmarked by July 31. Registration before July 31 is \$10.00 per class. Cancellations before July 31 will be given a refund less a \$15.00 handling fee. There will be no refund for cancellations after July 31, 2008. Registration and/or class changes on August 8 or 9 can be done between the hours of 7:00 and 8:00 AM ONLY.

All Amateur Exhibitors must provide an Amateur Card at the time of registration. If you do not have an Amateur card you may compete in Novice classes (if you fit the criteria) or Open classes.

An Entry Form must be completed for each Exhibitor/horse team combination. A copy of your MFTHBA registration papers must be included with your entry form.

Professional Status Cards for Open Exhibitors are not required for this show.

If you are arriving before Thursday, August 6, 2009 you must make prior arrangements with Robynn Gabel, 307-349-2049 for stalls and/or campsites. Do not check in at the Park County Fairgrounds office. All stalls and campsites are being handled through BHBFTA. All stalls and campsites are on a first come – first serve basis and will be assigned in the order of entry receipt.

The main arena will be open for riding Thursday, Aug 6, 2008.

The State of Wyoming requires a negative Coggins test on all horses coming into Wyoming from out of state and a brand inspection on all horses crossing county lines. Please have health certificates available when checking in.

SHOW RULES

- This Show will be run in accordance with the latest edition of the 2008 MFTHBA Versatility Circuit Championship rules. All rules can be found on the MFTHBA website at http://www.MFTHBA.com. It is the responsibility of the participants to know these rules and to be in compliance with the rules for the classes in which they are competing.
- Show management has the right to refuse the presence of any horse deemed unhealthy or unfit.
- Show management will not be held responsible for accidents involving contestants, horses, equipment or for the theft of equipment, horse or personal belongings. Once entry form is turned in it is an automatic acceptance of this rule.

Trail, Reining, and Horsemanship patterns will be posted at least one hour prior to class.

No tacking up of horses in camping area due to safety reasons.

- All dogs are to be on a leash and are not allowed in the riding arenas.
- All classes, except Championship Classes will place 1st through 5th.

Classes with fewer than three entrants maybe cancelled or combined.

- A rider may exhibit in a class multiple times, with different horses, but each team (rider and horse) compiles points. Rider and horse cannot be mixed for high point accumulation. In classes where all of the exhibitors enter the ring at the same time or fall into place on the rail after performing, a rider will only be able to exhibit one horse in that class.
- A Novice class rider and/or horse must not have won a first, second or third place ribbon in the class they are participating in, at any previous show. Novice riders may use a snaffle bit and are allowed to use two hands on the reins at all times, regardless of the age of the horse. A Novice class rider may not compete in Amateur classes unless they have a valid Amateur card.

Two year old fox trotters are not allowed to be shown under saddle.

In order to compete you must have signed and turned in a Waiver of Liability.

VERSATILITY CIRCUIT

The Versatility classes in this show are included in the Inter-Mountain Versatility Cirucit. To be elibible for the Versatility Circuit High Point you must compete in a minimum of five Versatility Classes with one of those five classes being a timed event in either poles or barrels. Points for 1st through 5th in the Division will be reported to MFTHBA.

You do not accrue circuit points in either Novice or Special Needs.

If you qualify as an Amateur and do not have an Amateur Card you can apply for this through the MFTHBA. You must submit a copy of your Amateur Card with your show registration papers if you are going to compete as an Amateur.

YOUTH RIDERS

Youth is defined as age 17 or under as of January 1, 2009.

NATURAL TRAIL COURSE

All tack must be in clean working order. You may dress as you would on trail. Jeans are acceptable as well as helmets. The cleaner, neater the attire the better the impression.

The horse must be a Missouri Fox Trotter but not necessarily registered. When it is noted "preferred gait" you may do the gait of choice, but more points will be gained by doing a foxtrot.

This event will be timed, to keep the event on schedule, but there are no points accrued for finishing faster than others. The point system for obstacles will be fashioned after the point system used in the MFTHBA rule book. The rules governing bits and excessive or harsh tack will be from the MFTHBA rule book. You may use two hands on the reins no matter the age of the horse. The horse must be 3 years of age and up.

There will be no canter, this is a two gait course. You and your horse will be judged on how well you work together and the calmness and responsiveness of the horse in negotiating obstacles. All obstacles will be fashioned after what you would actually encountered on the trail including brush, logs, bridges, animals, bikes, rain slicker, motorized vehicles, tents and water.

If you have entered the Trail Course in the Show in either Amateur, Open, Novice or Youth you may only enter this class in Section B of the class number.

STALLS

Stall fees are \$20.00 a day. Stall fees must accompany your entry fees. If you plan to arrive Wednesday you must make prior arrangements with the Show Chairman, Robynn Gabel, 307-349-2049, to have stalls opened.

One horse per stall and please bring your own bedding. We ask that you do not use straw, only shavings. If you forget shavings you can purchase them from BHBFTA at the show or at the local Big R. There is a limited supply so please bring your own.

There is a manure collection bin between barns. Please pick after your horse around the barn area.

Any horse kept at the fairgrounds overnight must be stalled and cannot be tied to a trailer. If you are attending just for the day you do not need to rent a stall. If you are camping please do not bring your horse to the campsite. There is ample parking in the parking lot next to the barns for horse trailers and tacking up.

Please do not dump or clean out horse trailers in the parking lot. Pick up and clean up after your horses and deposit manure in collection bins.

Please note: The overhead eave on the stalls between the rows extends out and is very low. The average horse trailer can catch under the eave and damage both trailer and barn. You are responsible for any damage you incur to the property.

There are wash stalls on both ends of the barn. Please bring your own hose.

CAMPING & RV HOOKUPS

There are full service RV hook ups at the Park County Fairgrounds. These sites are on the east side of the barns. There are bathroom and shower facilities available within walking distance of the barns. Campsites are a few feet from the barns.

Fees are \$25.00 per night, one camper per site. Your reservation for a campsite must be included with your registration.

Please note: Though there is electricity located in outlets on the barns these are not for RV or horse trailer live-in quarters. They are not designed for this and useage in this manner will blow the circuits. For this reason, if you need an extra stall for tack purposes only the fee will only be \$10.00 per day. Any one using the barn outlets for RV useage will be fined \$40.00 per day and asked to move.

Directions

Whether you are coming from east or west you will be on Alt 14 (Coulter Ave). From the west (Cody) you will go through town, look for McDonald's, Kentucky Fried Chicken/Taco Bell on your left, turn on Ferris St. Travel down past school and track field on left until you come to 5th St, which creates a T at the stop sign. You will see Park County Fairgrounds entrance across the street slightly to the right. Take a small right onto 5th St then a left into the gate. If coming from the east (Lovell) Ferris St will be on your right before Kentucky Fried/Taco Bell. Follow same directions from that point.
